Convention 2022 – February 24/25, 2022 (Virtual Convention)

➤ All ATA Teachers' Convention will be Virtual again this year!

- On June 10, 2021, members of Provincial Executive Council (PEC) determined that all 2022 Teachers' Conventions will be held virtually. Convention planning is a monumental task and involves a lot of moving pieces – speakers, vendors, facilities – all requiring contracts to be signed. Speakers and vendors are contracted in July, facilities in August. As such, planning for a virtual convention has no risks in terms of logistics, finances, or COVID.
- At its June 11, 2021 meeting, Table Officers Committee considered the province's staged timelines in relation to the directives and directions put in place for Council and Subgroups, and authorized that these emergency governance directives will end four weeks after the start of Stage Three of the Government of Alberta's "Open for Summer Plan. Additionally, previous decisions made to host an upcoming conference, convention, meeting, activity, or event, in a virtual format shall remain in a virtual format.
- No Convention Fee Increase this year.
