In a few conferences I've attended this was a good way to prevent the after lunch "decline" in participation by keeping people on site. The number of teachers who disappear after lunch is really growing because they leave the site and never come back. We need to offer opportunities for people to remain on site for lunch.

I thought the convention was very well organized with a wide range of options for everyone. Next year I will need to jump on the off site selections earlier as they did fill up fast.

As far as generalist conventions go, I found there was value in the convention. However, as a specialist at the high school level I feel that I would get more value attending a conference that focuses on my particular subject areas/focuses for growth. Perhaps it is worthwhile considering a model in which, rather than funding being spent on one large conference, teachers are allocated funding and a couple of substitute days and given the opportunity to attend a conference of their choice.

I am very disappointed with convention this year. I teach high school math and physics. There was a grand total of two sessions dedicated to high school math and science. One was biology related which I don't teach and the other was a calculator pitch.

I have put on my own sessions in the past; however, it shouldn't be on teachers solely to get good quality sessions in place for all teachers. The MCATA has no issue getting good presenters in place for their annual conferences. Other divisions have no issues getting good presenters out for their conventions. Additionally, the deadline to submit approval for a session is too tight. In June, I do not know what my February is going to look like or know what I would like to present on. The deadlines should be mid fall or early winter if you would like to have more good quality and experienced presenters sign up.

Meh... for the time it takes and money it costs to go to the city and book all the spaces, I feel it could be online and the money put towards the students.
