FICTION WRITING WORKSHOP

(2 Hours but Flexible Based on Class Length)

Purpose

Bringing a working writer into the classroom provides a "real life" view of the craft. Language Arts teachers say that it's beneficial for students to hear fiction writing techniques from someone other than themselves. Students participate in a variety of individual, small group and large group writing exercises. The workshop was originally designed for middle school but can be expanded or simplified for other grade levels.

<u>Overview</u>

We cover the following fiction writing elements:

- 1) Story Arc
- 2) Passion
- 3) Plot/Theme
- 4) Character & Dialogue
- 5) Setting
- 6) Conflict
- 7) Climax/Endings
- 8) Story Arc Part 2

Format

The students are involved with many hands-on exercises designed to help them identify and improve common fiction problem areas such as run-on sentences, dialogue confusion, weak conflict, bland settings and abrupt endings. The workshop is energetic and fun, targeted to those students who would prefer a root canal to writing a story.
