The KAIROS Blanket Exercise is a workshop that explores the nation-to-nation relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples in Canada. The workshop helps people to understand how the colonization of this land impacts those who were here long before settlers arrived. It engages people's minds and hearts in understanding why the relationship between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples is often broken and how we can take action together. The session will begin with a land acknowledgement followed by a Smudge ceremony. We will then go through an overview of the history of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, the 94 Calls to Actions, pre-blanket exercise activities, the blanket exercise, post blanket exercise discussion and activities. We will finish the day with a drum circle and/or dream catcher weaving session

A New Standard For Warming Up - What do you do with your students or athletes to warm up? The standard of practice has been variable, from laps around the gym, a dynamic warm up, to static stretching. New evidence has shown that warm ups that include agility, balance, strength and aerobic components significantly reduce rates of injury, improve fitness and develop movement skills. A recent study in Calgary junior high schools showed that students who consistently completed this type of neuromuscular warm up in their physical education classes had 62% fewer lower body injuries compared to their peers! Join us to learn what neuromuscular training is and how teachers, coaches and leaders across Alberta have been implementing it as a warm-up in the first 10 minutes of physical activity. Participants will leave with free resources created in partnership with Ever Active Schools, the Be Fit For Life Network, and the Sport Injury Prevention Research Centre at the University of Calgary, along with ideas to bring to the classroom on Monday morning.
